

- Trot to center of arena facing east, stop
- Perform 3 spins right
- Perform 3 ¼ spins left
- Beginning in right lead make one circle to the right
- Come to center of arena, change leads
- Complete circle to the left
- Come to center of arena and change leads
- Continue to right until top of arena
- Stop, rollback right
- Lope to other end of arena
- Stop, rollback left
- Lope to center of arena
- Stop, back 2 horselengths
- Call for cow

Sublette County Fair Ranch Horse Contest
Saturday, July 25, 2009 3:00 P.M.
Big Piney, Wyoming

The ranch horse competition will consist of entering the arena via a gate, a reining pattern consisting of two lead changes, a spin in two directions, two rollbacks and a stop and backup. Competitor will then call for a cow, box the cow, turn the cow along the fence in both directions and then rope and stop the cow. There will be a 5 minute time limit. Judge's sheets will be displayed. Women and seniors will circle the cow both directions and not rope. Competition is scored and timed.

Open - This division is designed for the competitor who has won \$1000 in cash and or prizes in Reined Cow Horse, Reining, and or Ranch Horse competitions.

Rancher - This is a class designed for the working cowboy and or amateur horseman.

Novice Rancher - This division is designed for the entry level competitor. Ideally the competitor will have very limited or no experience in the show pen in a cattle class involving boxing and turning on a fence.

Youth - Identical to the above classes except age of 16 and under the day of the show.

Women - Same rules as the rancher except females only. Women circle the cow and do not rope.

Senior - Any competitor age 55 and greater. Class requirements are the same as the rancher except circle the cow and do not rope.

Any competitor can move up in class and or enter more than one class. That is, a rancher class competitor can show in the open. A woman can show in the rancher and or open, etc.

The horse is to be owned and or leased at least 6 months prior to the show by the exhibitor and or an immediate family member. The horse can be shown in more than one division by the exhibitor and/or an immediate family member.

Equipment - This is a ranch horse contest that will mirror most of the equipment used daily on a ranch. No restrictions as to mouthpiece, curbs or reins. Exceptions: No tie downs or easy stops.

As a general rule if you use it on the ranch it will be allowed in the contest. Example: A senior horse can use a snaffle, roping reins are permitted, chain curbs are permitted. If a competitor is riding a young horse or is somewhat uncomfortable roping, a breakaway is permitted. All things being equal the competitor using a breakaway will not score as high as a roped and stopped yearling but the contest is designed that this should not cause a large point loss in total score.

Cost- \$75 per entry all classes. \$1500 added equally between the classes (sponsors: Sublette County Fair Board and Wells Fargo Bank). Buckles to winners of all divisions.
